Annex 1 Mandatory Conditions

1. If this premises licence authorises the supply/sale of alcohol, the following two conditions apply:
 - i. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or at a time when the designated supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
 - ii. Every supply/sale of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
2. If this premises licence authorises the exhibition of film(s), the admission of children under the age of 18 years is restricted in accordance with the age restrictions of the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) or authority designated under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.
3. If this premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity (as defined by the Private Security Industry Act 2001) then such individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

(Condition 4 effective from 6th April 2014)

4. (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

8. The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”

Annex 2 Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Conditions agreed with Sussex Police and 5 Guys JV Limited

1. A CCTV system with recording equipment shall be installed, operated and maintained at the premises (unforeseen faults excepted). Images will be retained for a minimum of 28 days and supplied to a police officer upon reasonable request subject to the Data Protection Act 1998.

2. Members of staff authorised to sell alcohol shall receive training on the law with regard to alcohol sales (including the prohibition of sale of alcohol to those who are under age and those who are drunk). Staff records of such training shall be retained for 12 months and refresher training in relation to the sale and supply of alcohol and wider requirements under the Licensing Act 2003 shall be taken prior to selling alcohol, and thereafter at least annually.

3. The premises will operate a “Challenge 25” Proof of Age Scheme, whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under 25 will be asked for photographic identification to prove their age. Acceptable identification for the purposes of age verification will include a driving licence, passport or photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and date of birth. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of photographic identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to that person.

4. Challenge 25 Proof of Age signage shall be displayed within the premises .
